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# **Our School Story in Action**

Each week, we will try to share a part of <u>our School Story</u> and how it applies to our community's daily learning. Our School Story is based on the Core Competencies found in the BC Curriculum.

This week, we would like to highlight the Rainbow Club. The Rainbow Club is a safe and inclusive space where students may get together to play games, build with Lego and Keva, draw, do crafts and read. They can interact with peers from different classes and grades. This links to our <u>School Story</u> focus in the following way:

**Understanding relationships and cultural contexts** - "Students understand that their relationships and cultural contexts help to shape who they are. This includes culture in its broadest sense, including how one identifies in terms of ethnicity, nationality, language(s), abilities, sexual orientation, gender identity, age, geographic region, and religious or spiritual beliefs. Students explore who they are in terms of their relationship to others and their relationship to the world (people and place) around them."
