Our School Story in Action

Each week, we will try to share a part of <u>our School Story</u> and how it applies to our community's daily learning. Our School Story is based on the Core Competencies found in the BC Curriculum.

As we recognized Pink Shirt Day this week, we would like to highlight a schoolwide kindness activity. Classes had the opportunity to share messages of kindness, self-love and self-acceptance using words and drawings. Messages were arranged to create the Progressive Pride flag, a symbol that acknowledges love, inclusivity and the ongoing work we are doing to ensure acceptance and safety of all types of families, relationships, gender identities and gender expressions. As we continue to explore Black History Month, the hands holding up the Progressive Pride flag represent the contributions and importance of the marginalized voices of Black, Indigenous and People of Colour.

This links to our **School Story** focus in the following way:

Understanding relationships and cultural contexts - "Students understand that their relationships and cultural contexts help to shape who they are. This includes culture in its broadest sense, including how one identifies in terms of ethnicity, nationality, language(s), abilities, sexual orientation, gender identity, age, geographic region, and religious or spiritual beliefs. Students explore who they are in terms of their relationship to others and their relationship to the world (people and place) around them."
