School Story in Action 2024-2025

November 1, 2024

This week we would like to highlight the Student Vote BC 2024 run by C.I.V.I.X. CIVIX is a nonpartisan national charity who work with Elections BC to provide students with a handson opportunity to learn about the voting process. Before students vote, teachers share lessons from a teacher's guide that talk about forms of government, levels of government in Canada, and different government responsibilities. Before the vote, students are encouraged to talk with their families and are aware of the street signs as they come to school and often have animated conversations and bring back information to the classroom to share with other students. Then some volunteer students pretend to be the candidates and give speeches to the other classrooms based on the candidate's platform. Other students teach the classes the process of voting and how to mark ballets. Every year, there are always rejected ballots meaning those students didn't get to have their say in the results of the election. Students learn that their vote counts when the election can be really close, which mirrors the adult election where one riding is only 12 votes apart. Students often come back and talk about their memories of the student vote and the real world applications and connections. It makes world news more understandable.
